
Resurfacing and Painting Update

As anticipated, work stopped as the air temperature dropped; winter arrived. As soon as the temperature rises to a satisfactory level, the project will resume. We anticipate (in the perfect scenario) that the majority of the area above the hull will be completed by June in order to avoid interruption of the tours. The hull will likely be the last area to be resurfaced.

Crewmember's Letters Home Come Full-Circle



We recently received copies of letters that were written by a crew member to his family. Ralph Jerold "Jerry" Baum served aboard the Mackinaw WAGB83 from 1946 – 1949. The letters will be displayed in the berthing area of the ship to portray a bit of "Life in the Coast Guard." Notice that there is no postage stamp; it reads "free."

"Maggie of the Mackinaw" Edited Excerpt from "USCGC Mackinaw" by Mike Fornes

Ken Patrick served on the Mackinaw from October 1955 until May 1957. The way Patrick tells it, "That time in the Coast Guard changed my life. It was a time to grow up. Often people pass through our lives, and we fail to recognize the influence they have. Many played a role in helping me to determine what direction my life would take, including a mascot on the Mackinaw, a dog named 'Maggie'.

"I remember one time in 1957 when the ship was in dry dock in Manitowoc; it was our first afternoon after arriving. Three of us decided to head to the pub in a cab, and we took Maggie with us. She was a hit, as we were also. If you remember, everyone loved the Coast Guard, and they adopted our mascot, too. She was given leftover beer by the patrons and seemed to be having a great time.

"After several hours of partying, we met some girls. We were ready to continue our tour of town but now with female escorts. Sadly, there was no room for Maggie. We all tried to convince each other it was their duty to take Maggie back to the ship but to no avail. We finally came to the conclusion that we couldn't leave without our new friends. We had to find a solution for Maggie.

"We finally did. Maggie was put in the back seat of a cab by herself, a little tipsy perhaps," Patrick concluded. "The cabbie probably thought he'd seen it all until he was told to drive the dog to the shipyard dock, open the door and let her out.

"We paid the cabbie and gave him a nice tip, and off went Maggie back to the ship. We often wondered what other drivers thought pulling up to a traffic light, seeing a dog in the back seat of a cab. Nothing but first class for our Maggie!"

For years afterward, the crew of the Mackinaw told the story of the night Maggie showed up in a cab, jumped out the door and trotted across the yard and up the brow to the ship!



The ship's newsletter later reported that since Maggie could not identify the father, she was disqualified. The dog was noted for rushing at landing helicopters and snapping at exhaust pipes. She rarely had whiskers....






Tom Dellabeck holds WAGB-83 Mascot, "Maggie," seen here as a
