




On Facebook, Steve Sola shared this video of the tugboat, *North Carolina*, breaking ice in Duluth, MN, on January 16, 2020. She was preparing for the winter lay-up of the 1000' ore carrier, *M/V American Spirit*.

The *North Carolina* was built in 1952 in Bay City, MI by Defoe Shipbuilding.

I- [Information]- Gather as much information as you can on local ice conditions, check the forecasted weather conditions that's expected for the duration of your outdoor adventure; let friends/ family know where you are going and expected time of return. Always remember that you can reach out to us here at Coast Guard Station Marquette if you need tips on ice/water safety.

C- [Clothing]- Dress for the occasion. Simply put, if it's cold, dress warm. Head gear, upper and lower layers, hand protectors, insulated footwear, etc. It is also best practice to wear bright reflective gear so in the case of an emergency situation, rescue services can locate your position faster.


E- [Equipment]- Ensure that you have the proper gear for your outdoor activity. Ice staffs to check the conditions of the ice you will be walking across. Ice awls, or something similar such as screw drivers or ice picks for emergency situations you can use these tools to grasp onto the ice to help better your chances of pulling yourself out. Means of communication such as cell phone, radios, loud hailer, anything that can be used to grab the attention of others if you're in need.






See the 20 ton deck crane for the WLBB 30 Mackinaw in action.




Crane Completed. Working on stacks. (right)









